Redeemer was blessed to have two talented and thoughtful visitors come for our accreditation visit. Mrs. Jennifer Lee, principal at Zion Lutheran School, and Mrs. Sheila Wells, retired administrator and current teacher at Cornerstone Christian Academy, spent four days meeting with focus groups, poring over our accreditation document, observing in the classrooms, and collaborating on a detailed report and accreditation recommendation. We are thankful for their honest and productive feedback and look forward to implementing an action plan that will continue to encourage growth and a joy filled school community. We must wait until the WASC governing body reads through the reports and confers the accreditation term, but we are confident that Redeemer will be accredited for the next term cycle.

The top 5 identified areas of strength are:

- 1. The SLOs directly reflect the core values and mission statement which are in unison with the church ministry.
- 2. The administration makes a conscious effort to include teachers in the decision-making process; teachers have a voice that is respected and heard.
- 3. Strong employee retention and positive and supportive attitude of all stakeholders.
- Redeemer's strategic planning process is creating a solid foundation for continued growth, and the united planning process equally weaves church and school into the goals for added accountability.
- 5. Redeemer School has built a reputation as a school that welcomes and supports a wide range of students with various learning differences.

The top 5 areas for growth are:

- 1. Establish a clear school identity defining school philosophy and population it serves.
- 2. Develop a clear, concise, aligned instructional philosophy.
- 3. Create a school scope and sequence or curriculum map across subjects and grade levels and review regularly.
- 4. Professional development goals for the ministry need to be created to ensure growth in teaching pedagogy; Redeemer needs to look for additional training programs and workshops to continually equip teachers to meet the education needs of students throughout the spectrum of needs.
- 5. Formalize "Tribal Knowledge".

We are thankful to the WASC team, the parents and students who have been involved throughout the process, and the ministry team that supports us throughout the year. As we near the close of another school year, we are anxiously planning for the implementation of our new action plan that should carry us through the next 3-6 years.

### COLOMA OUTDOOR DISCOVERY SCHOOL April 9-11, 2019 By Mrs. Gina Wilson

Eureka! The 4th Graders found GOLD! At the beginning of April, the fourth grade class traveled back in time, as "greenhorns", to experience life as a prospector in 1849. On our first day, they bartered for goods at a local trading store, baked cornbread over a fire, built a shelter to protect themselves against the rain and hail which arrived just on time, and most exciting of all, panned for gold. Unfortunately, their luck was about as good as many of the prospectors of 1849, and no one struck it rich. They did however strike it rich in another area. Through these activities, the kids learned to work together as a team in effort to achieve their goals! It was exciting to watch them grow and learn through these hands-on experiences. At the end of the day, we celebrated by participating in a good old-fashioned hoedown. The kids learned the Virginia Real and learned about instruments that may have been played in the evenings after a hard day of prospecting.

On the second day, we headed out on the trails of the state park. Each student learned about a native plant and its uses, and then had the opportunity to teach the others in their group. Everyone enjoyed a picnic lunch on the trail, learning the importance of not wasting by participating in the "Apple Challenge." Most of our class earned their "Apple Badge," by eating an ENTIRE apple, seeds, stems, and all. After lunch, their courage was tested as they walked a part of the trail solo, and in silence. After coming off the trail, students participated in a scavenger hunt, while exploring historic buildings around Sutter's Mill. After a hearty dinner, a special Native American presenter, Kimberly Morning Star, shared traditional music, instruments, and stories. Through her stories and songs, she inspired the students to go out and make positive change in their communities.

On our final day, taking into account all they had learned, the students were pronounced "sourdoughs." They celebrated their learning through a special ceremony in which they dunked their gold pouches into the river. After the ceremony, they worked together to create an environmental action plan. Our fourth grade class decided they would like to help our community by cleaning trash around the school, reducing food waste at lunch, and giving out more complements each day. Our trip to Coloma Outdoor Discovery School was a fabulous, growing opportunity for each of Redeemer's fourth graders. We send a great thank you to all the parents for supporting this invaluable learning experience!






#### CULTURE WEEK March 25-28, 2019
