DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION ESSAY CONTEST

Every fall, our students in grades 5-8 have the opportunity to participate in the annual Daughters of the American Revolution Contest. The students are given an essay prompt and word count limits. They are required to complete research to better understand life in that time era as well as integrate in narrative writing techniques.

The topic for the 2018 DAR writing contest was Women's Suffrage. The specific prompt was: The 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution was passed by the United States Congress on June 4, 1919, and was ratified on August 18, 1920. This amendment granted all American women the right to vote and hold elective office. Many Americans at the time viewed this as a radical change to the U.S. Constitution. Imagine you are living in 1919 while the women's suffrage campaigns were having impact on Americans politically and socially. Discuss the pros and cons of this new amendment the U.S. Congress has passed.

This writing essay contest is a national competition sponsored by the local DAR chapters. Our local chapter, Gaspar de Portola, presents awards to their chapter essay winners. On Sunday, March 16th, Redeemer hosted The Daughters of The American Revolution American History Essay Contest winners. Essay contest winners came from Menlo Atherton High School, Sunnyvale, and Redeemer. Each individual read an excerpt from their essay and were awarded a certificate, medal, and cash.


