PAJAMA JAM JAM DANCE! January 11, 2019



Developing the Author in Each Student

Each year, we are thrilled with the number of our graduates who place into advanced English classes in their Freshman year. Though not all choose the path of honors classes, 100% of our graduates last year placed into honors English classes for the Sequoia Union High School District. This success is in part due to the relationships Mrs. Davis has cultivated with local high school teachers, allowing her to teach the critical skills our students need to be successful at a high level as they move out of Redeemer. We have also seen an increase in our students' placement levels since the adoption of our current writing program, Writers' Workshop.

Writers' Workshop is taught in first through fifth grades at Redeemer and is an instructional model that views writing as an ongoing process in which students follow a given set of procedures for planning, drafting, revising, editing, and publishing their writing. It allows students to be at various stages of the writing process at one time. Collaboration with peers and teacher is inherent in this model.

Writing Workshop follows a general process which includes:

- Start a New Unit
- · Generate Notebook Entries
- · Choose and Develop Seed Idea
- Create a Draft
- Revise Draft
- · Edit, Publish, and Reflect

Within every step of this process, teachers are teaching traits of writing in the genres of narrative, expository, and persuasive in the form of mini lessons. By studying how published authors have used these traits in their craft, seeing the traits modeled by the teacher in their mini lessons, and learning to use these traits within their own writing, our students hone the craft of writing.

The process of writing is time consuming and our goal is for each student in grades 1-5 to publish at least one piece in each of the three genres each year. These pieces are kept at school and saved for our Authors' Night in the spring. So, if you don't see the more creative writing coming home in the Friday Folders, have no fear, your authors are hard at work and will be sharing all their masterpieces at the end of the year. Make sure to mark your calendar now for **Tuesday, May 7**th to join us in our annual Authors' Night as our authors present one of their favorite pieces.
